Vice President John Gumann started the meeting with the Pledge of Allegiance. He then led our club in a moment of silence for all of our departed members. John also reminded those in attendance, that our meetings are governed by Roberts Rules of Order; and that only regular members may vote or present motions

The minutes for the July meeting were deemed to be correct by the attending membership.

Secretary – Phil Engert reminded the membership to contact him if you have any difficulties with your electronic access cards to the clubhouse.

Shotgun - Don Mercovich No report.

Rifle—Bill Murphy reported the next High Power rifle match will be Sunday, August 24th.

High power is the 4th Sunday of the month. Please arrive by 9:30 for sign in. The match starts at 10:00. Ends 11:30 - 11:45.Bring something to lay on concrete is rough. Even a light recoiling rifle will cut you up. Rember to bring Eye protection, Ear protection, Chamber flag/Open bolt indicator, 50 rounds for match, plus sighters. Spotting scope is helpful. (Very Helpful). Sling is very helpful. \$7 members \$10 non-members.

Pistol – Jim Owings reminded the membership the Empty Chamber Indicators are required for every gun that is exposed on the firing line. He sells them for \$1 each at this meeting, and you can also buy them from the vending machine in the clubhouse.

Jim also reminded everyone that the 100 yard target frame drawing in the Range Rules is only to be used when shooting at 100 yards. If shooting at a shorter distance the target frame legs will have to be taller than on the 100 yard frame. As target gets closer to the shooter, the frame must continue to be taller so that the bullets will go through the bullseye and into the impact area of the berm. The closer the distance the taller the target frame must be.

He also reminded that at this time of year with the Sunset coming earlier, that you must stop shooting 30 minutes before sunset. Sunset times are posted in the clubhouse.

Jim reminded everyone that if you are shooting aluminum or steel cased cartridges on the Indoor Range, that it is YOUR RESPONSI-BILITY to sort and dispose of them SEPARATELY. There are 2 different cans to receive BRASS –or- STEEL/ALUMINUM cases; and it is very difficult to separate the cases once mixed!

Pistol League - Nick Dewar

The Pistol League shooting Programs are now shown on the Website under Activities, Pistol League, icon Upcoming Events. We recently completed a Periodic Cleaning of the Indoor Range and would like to share with you what is involved in our Periodic Cleaning. The Protocols are as follow:

- 1. Turn on the Ventilation System.
- 2. Remove all furniture from the Range and put it outside the side exit door where the table tops are washed.
- 3. Remove all lead from the Bullet Trap.
- 4. HEPA vacuum the the entire floor before washing.
- 5. Wash the floor.
- 6. Rinse the floor with clean water.
- 7. Repeat steps 5 and 6
- 8. Clean all of the overhead baffles
- 9. Clean all of the heat vents on the back wall of the Range
- 10 Replace all of the furniture in the Range
- 11 Turn off the Ventilation System.

Additionally, the entire Indoor Range is HEPA vacuumed every Friday morning.

SAFETY ITEM: Empty Chamber Indicators (ECIs) are required on all uncased firearms on the shooting benches and they must be pointed down range.

Cowboy Action—John Seal John reported that they had their 10 year Anniversary last month. Cowboy action mainly shoots single action weapons from the 1860's-1900'x.

Cowboy Action holds a regular event every third Sunday of the month as long as weather permits. They shoot pistols and rifles from the 1800's, use leather holsters, shotgun shell belts, and cowboy hats and boots. Participants are \$10/member, \$15/nonmember. Everyone is welcome to come and just watch if you'd like.

NRA Training – Adam Maurer reported the following upcoming classes

He encourages all members to take advantage of this training, as it is available at a discount to standard NRA rates.

USPSA—Ron Gumann John Gumman reported for Ron that they had 57 participants for the August USPSA match, same as July's count.

USPSA matches at Shongum are typically capped at 60, which is four squads of 15. Once full we establish a wait list for those who contact us. We have exceeded 60 at times.

We have also instituted a policy to prioritize registration. We have reserved slots for certified USPSA RO's who want to work the match. We prefer to have two per squad or at least one, with other experienced folks. Then folks who show up early and help set up. Third is Shongum members. We do not want to turn away any Shongum member and will always accommodate them even if they just walk on match day. Last is all others. We generally work the wait list in as some folks drop during the week between registration and match. To date, we have not turned anyone away, but just in case, we have set up a priority for us to follow. We posted this on the Shongum USPSA FB page:

As an FYI, when folks register on line they can identify as RO or Shongum member so we know. We know the set up crew/volunteers from experience.
