Shotgun - Don Mercovich No report.

Rifle—Bill Murphy reported that upgrades to the target from on the Rifle Range were recently completed. He then advised that the next High Power rifle match will be Sunday, September 28th.

High power is the 4th Sunday of the month. Please arrive by 9:30 for sign in. The match starts at 10:00. Ends 11:30-11:45.Bring something to lay on concrete is rough. Even a light recoiling rifle will cut you up. Rember to bring Eye protection, Ear protection, Chamber flag/Open bolt indicator, 50 rounds for match, plus sighters. Spotting scope is helpful. (Very Helpful). Sling is very helpful. \$7 members \$10 non-members.

Pistol – **Jim Owings** reminded the membership to review the Range Rules when attending the club and that Empty Chamber Indicators are REQUIRED for every gun that is exposed on the firing line. He sells them for \$1 each at this meeting, and you can also buy them from the vending machine in the clubhouse.

He also reminded that at this time of year with the Sunset coming earlier, that you must stop shooting 30 minutes before sunset. Sunset times are posted in the clubhouse.

Cowboy Action—John Seal Not attending.

Cowboy Action holds a regular event every third Sunday of the month as long as weather permits. They shoot pistols and rifles from the 1800's, use leather holsters, shotgun shell belts, and cowboy hats and boots. Participants are \$10/member, \$15/non-member. Everyone is welcome to come and just watch if you'd like.

NRA Training – Adam Maurer John reported for Adam that there are new training courses on the calendar, and encourages all members to take advantage of this training. Please check the website and reach out to Adam for details.

USPSA—Ron Gumann John Gumman reported for Ron that they had 52 participants for the September USPSA match. Anticipating deteriorating weather, this match was shortened to wrap up before the afternoon storms, ending at 1:00pm.

USPSA matches at Shongum are typically capped at 60, which is four squads of 15. Once full we establish a wait list for those who contact us. We have exceeded 60 at times.

We have also instituted a policy to prioritize registration. We have reserved slots for certified USPSA RO's who want to work the match. We prefer to have two per squad or at least one, with other experienced folks. Then folks who show up early and help set up. Third is Shongum members. We do not want to turn away any Shongum member and will always accommodate them even if they just walk on match day. Last is all others. We generally work the wait list in as some folks drop during the week between registration and match. To date, we have not turned anyone away, but just in case, we have set up a priority for us to follow. We posted this on

As an FYI, when folks register on line they can identify as RO or Shongum member so we know. We know the set up crew/volunteers from experience.
